

Information on Unemployment in the Czech Republic by June 30, 2024

By June 30, 2024 job offices registered altogether 272,684 job seekers. That is by 1,638 less than at the end of May. The number of job seekers increased by 22,892 persons compared with the same period of the preceding year. The number of available job seekers in age 15 to 64 years (job seekers currently available for work) was 250,337.

In the course of job offices registered altogether 31,395 newcomers. That is by 1,140 job seekers less than in the preceding month and by 173 newly registered job seekers less than in June of the preceding year.

In June, job offices registration was terminated with 33,033 seekers. New jobs have been taken up by 24,267 persons. In the course of the above-said month, job offices excluded 8,766 job seekers due to other reasons.

A monthly increase of unemployed was registered **by 23 districts** – Most (4.4 %), Písek (3.2 %), Vyškov (3.1 %), Tábor (3.0 %), Tachov (2.9 %), Olomouc (2.1 %), Domažlice (1.7 %), Praha-západ (1.1 %). **A monthly decrease of unemployed** was registered **by 52 districts** – relatively the greatest decrease was monitored in districts Jeseník (6.5 %), Rychnov nad Kněžnou (5.6 %), Prachatice (4.8 %), Cheb (3.8 %), Semily (3.6 %), Český Krumlov (3.4 %), Klatovy (3.4 %), Břeclav (3.3 %).

By June 30, 2024, 11,234 school leavers with all levels of education **and juveniles were registered.** Thus they share in the total unemployment by 4.1 % (May – 4.5 %, June 2023 – 3.8 %).

At the end of June, job offices registered 148,630 female job seekers, that is 54.5 % of the unemployed in total, and **37,195 persons with reduced working capacity,** that is 13.6 % of the unemployed in total.

In June 2024, job offices paid off unemployment benefits 79,955 job seekers, that is 29.3 % of all job seekers under registration (May – 30.2 %, June 2023 – 28.1 %).

By June 2024, there were 10 900 jobseekers supported through financial benefits of active employment policy.

By June 30, 2024, the share of unemployed was 3.6 % (May – 3.6 %, June 2023 – 3.4 %), time series - <https://www.mpsv.cz/web/cz/casove-rady-mn-a-pno>. Share of unemployed equal or higher than average of the Czech Republic was shown in 29 districts, the highest being in Most (8.4 %), Karviná (8.1 %), Chomutov (6.9 %), Bruntál (6.6 %), Ústí nad Labem (5.9 %), Louny (5.7 %), Ostrava-město (5.6 %), Děčín (5.6 %). The lowest share of unemployed was in districts Praha-východ (1.4 %), Praha-západ (1.6 %), Rychnov nad Kněžnou (1.9 %), Benešov (1.9 %), Pelhřimov (2.0 %), Plzeň-jih (2.1 %), Jičín (2.2 %), Zlín (2.3 %).

Share of unemployed - men was 3.2 % and share of unemployed - women was 4.0 %.

By June 30, 2024, job offices registered altogether 263,552 vacancies. That is by 2,965 vacancies less than in the preceding month and by 23,138 vacancies less than in the same period of the preceding year. At present, there have been 1.0 job seekers for one vacancy at average, the highest amount being in districts of Karviná (10.3), Bruntál (6.0), Hodonín (5.2), Děčín (4.8), Most (4.6), Blansko (3.9), Jablonec nad Nisou (3.9).

In this monitored period, there were registered by job offices 10,279 vacancies for persons with reduced working capacity that is 3.6 seekers per vacancy. In the case of school leavers and juveniles, there were registered altogether 48,716 vacancies, that is 0.2 seekers per vacancy.

Unemployment rate (EUROSTAT – ILO, NSA data) was **2.6 % in May 2024**.
